#### **Resources:**

**AHRQ ECHO National Nursing Home COVID-19 Action Network:** Offers training for nursing facilities at training centers around the U.S. to implement evidence-based best practices focused on the prevention of COVID-19 from entering and spreading in nursing homes, including early detection, safe and appropriate care, and in reducing social isolation for residents, families, and staff. Eligible nursing facilities may receive federal funding to support the implementation and adoption of quality improvement practices and measures through the CARES Act Provider Relief Fund (PRF). **CMS Nursing Home Resource Center:** Provides information for nursing home providers and CMS partners on regulations and guidance, training and resources, technical information, payment policy, and recent COVID-19 data and related policies. **Deaths From COVID-19 in Rural, Micropolitan, and Metropolitan Areas: A County-Level Comparison:** Presents a study on the difference in rates of mortality from COVID-19 in rural versus urban areas. Discusses the factors that predict COVID-19 mortality, such as elderly populations and limited access to healthcare, among others. Breaks down data in rural, metropolitan, and micropolitan counties and highlights COVID-19 cases, hospital beds, and unemployment rate, among other mortality measures in those counties. Notes from the Field: Development of an Enhanced Community-Focused COVID-19 Surveillance Program — Hopi Tribe, June–July 2020: Describes a collaboration between the Hopi Tribe Department of Health and Human Services, Hopi Health Care Center, and CDC to provide house-to-house COVID-19 surveillance and education in a rural, low-resource setting using community health representatives and volunteers. ### In the News:

Nov 9, 2020 -- <u>Cultural Traditions Carry American Indians, Alaska Natives Through COVID-19</u> — and Create Risks: Highlights efforts by the Navajo Nation to combat the spread of COVID-19 in their communities, describes how a combination of health education, curfews, and moving cultural practices to the digital world has decreased cases. Discusses the impact of the pandemic on disparities present in Native American communities.

Nov 9, 2020 -- <u>Rural Hospitals Are Dying. This One Saved Itself—and Its Community</u>: Features a struggling rural hospital in South Georgia and the CEO that helped turn it around with the help of a seasoned CEO from another rural hospital. After implementing a swing bed program and taking in patients from out of town, the rural hospital improved financially, allowing the hospital to prepare for and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Nov 4, 2020 -- <u>Despite COVID-19 Disruptions, Randle Library Works to Help Isolated</u> <u>Veterans</u>: Highlights the Veteran Connection Café, opened by a library in rural Washington in 2019 to provide healthcare and benefit services to veterans. The café closed during the COVID-19 pandemic, but the library continued to offer services by providing veterans with a Chromebook and access to Wi-Fi.
